- 1. Why are you running for the DCCC and what do you hope to accomplish if elected or re-elected? I am running for DCCC because I believe as a collective group we can accomplish a great deal. I believe that we can get things done more quickly and efficiently when we work with people who have different viewpoints, versus working against them. My style is like a mediator's, balancing the interests of different parties. I want to see the DCCC to be more efficient. We can work out differences with honesty and transparency rather than dealing in back room politics as the DCCC has unfortunately become.
