Minutes of the Potrero Hill Democratic Club September 6, 2011

- 1. The meeting of the Potrero Hill Democratic Club (the "PHDC") was held at the Potrero Hill Neighborhood House on September 6, 2011. Ballots for the PHDC's endorsements for mayor, district attorney, and sheriff were distributed to the PHDC membership prior to the meeting.
- 2. Joni Eisen called the meeting to order at 6:15 pm local time.
- 3. The minutes of the August 2, 2011 meeting of the PHDC were approved by acclamation.
- 4. Monisha Mustapha delivered the Political Action Report. Ms. Mustapha informed the PHDC Membership of two different community service opportunities. On September 17, 2011, an International Coastal Cleanup Day activity would take place at Warm Water Cove, located at the end of 24th Street. On September 24, 2011, the PHDC would register voters at Artfest 4, located along Third Street in the Bayview.
- 5. J.R. Eppler moderated the District Attorney Candidate Forum. Candidates Sharmin Bock, Bill Fazio, George Gascon, and David Onek participated in the forum.
- 6. Following the conclusion of the District Attorney Candidate Forum at 7:50 pm, the PHDC recessed for ten minutes.
- 7. At 8:00 pm, Ms. Eisen called the meeting back to order, and introduced Paul Miyamoto, candidate for sheriff.
- 8. Following Mr. Miyamoto's presentation to the PHDC, Ms. Eisen introduced Chris Cunnie, candidate for sheriff.
- 9. Following Mr. Cunnie's presentation to the PHDC and a brief discussion by the membership, Ms. Eisen introduced Ross Mirkarimi, candidate for sheriff.
- 10. Following Mr. Mirkarimi's presentation to the PHDC, Ms. Eisen announced that a local ballot proposition endorsement meeting would be held on September 13, 2011. Ms.

Eisen then called for all ballots for the endorsement of mayor, district attorney, and sheriff to be returned.

- 11. There being no further business before the PHDC, Ms. Eisen adjourned the meeting at 8:50 pm.
- 12. Following the meeting, ballots for the endorsement of mayor, district attorney, and sheriff were counted. Following the tabulation of the ranked-choice votes (going through two or more rounds of counting for each race until one candidate reached the 60% endorsement threshold) as witnessed by two observers, the PHDC made the following endorsements for the November ballot:

• Mayor: Dennis Herrera.

• <u>District Attorney</u>: David Onek.

• Sheriff: Chris Cunnie.
